- 3. Applicants must have earned a **minimum of 2.0 GPA** at previous academic institutions. Applicants who have not met the 2.0 GPA criteria must attach a written statement requesting special consideration of acceptance.
- 4. Two (2) letters of recommendation.
- 5. If you attended high school or college under a **different name**, please ask the institution(s) to indicate your current name on the transcript.
