Prior to joining the Office of the Speaker, George served for seven years as senior tax staff, including Chief Tax Counsel and Staff Director for the Subcommittee on Select Revenue Measures, on the House Ways and Means Committee, where he worked closely with three chairmen (Dave Camp, Paul Ryan, and Kevin Brady). During his tenure as Chief Tax Counsel, George worked on the revenue aspects of several pieces of trade legislation. While working on the Hill, he also served as Counsel to the US House of Representatives Committee on the Budget, was Legislative Director and Senior Advisor to Senator George Voinovich.
