Professor Robert Mikos is one of the nation's leading authorities on marijuana law and policy. Over the past decade he has published, testified, consulted, and lectured extensively on the competing approaches to regulating marijuana and the struggles among federal, state, and local officials for control over this policy domain. Professor Mikos has also published the pioneering textbook on the subject, [Marijuana Law, Policy, and Authority](#) (Wolters Kluwer 2017), and a companion [website](#) that analyzes breaking developments in the field. He earned his A.B. cum laude from Princeton University and his J.D. summa cum laude from the University of Michigan. After graduation, Mikos clerked for Chief Judge Michael Boudin of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit. He now teaches Constitutional Law, Federalism, and Marijuana Law and Policy at Vanderbilt University. Professor Mikos has also taught at the University of Michigan, the University of Notre Dame, and the University of California, Davis.
