This memorandum provides your <u>Orientation</u> assignments from the **JDEdge** online program, which you should complete in the coming weeks. Additional memoranda will follow in July with assignments for the <u>Delaware Law Engages</u> portion of Orientation, as well as an <u>Orientation Reading Supplement</u>. These materials are designed to maximize your opportunity to get the most from your legal education from day one.

As explained in the Introductory Orientation memorandum, we've partnered with AccessLex Institute®, the largest nonprofit organization focusing on access, affordability, and the value of legal education for aspiring lawyers, to bring you JDEdge by AccessLex SM, an online, asynchronous program with some live sessions, designed specifically for rising 1Ls. JDEdge will remain available to you throughout your first semester.

Registering for JDEdge: In order to access the JDEdge program, you'll need to take a moment to register for an account. Visit AskEDNA.AccessLex.org and click on the "register" button at the top of the page. Your name, email address, school and class year are all you need to log in to the program, personalize your experience, and track your progress. No other personal information is required, and all information remains confidential. Once you're registered, be sure to bookmark the landing page for easy access for the rest of the summer and through the end of the fall semester.

<u>JDEdge Assignments</u>: JDEdge includes over 20 hours of videos, classes, and exercises designed to introduce key concepts for the study and practice of law. We've curated these materials to create a tailored list of assignments that you should complete in the coming weeks, prior to Orientation. The assigned components of the program will take you approximately four hours to complete and will complement other Orientation assignments and programming. You are of course free to participate in all additional aspects of the JDEdge program at your preference - we encourage you to explore all the offerings to see what interests you!
